





In this entertaining book with rhyming text, young children are invited to explore all the different boxes we find in our lives and what they are used for. With a little investigation, boxes are found in so many shapes and have so many uses; from carrying fruit or playing hopscotch, to a house for bees, or a case for a guitar. What constitutes a box? What size is it? What fits inside? What is it used for? Endless amount of discussion will result from this book and even the titular question will get kids thinking? A perfect book to initiate early years scientific inquiry in a fun and inventive way and set children on the path to thinking critically, creatively and reflectively.




### **Emmett** By MARJORIE CROSBY-FAIRALL



This book, with its clear parallels to STEM\*, project design, and creative problem solving, also explores themes of misconceptions, empathy, and handling new situations. Emmett discovers, he doesn't know all there is to know about cats. Marjorie Crosby-Fairall delivers a story that will inspire young readers to look at everyday objects and challenging situations in a new and imaginative way. Her art style is classic and fresh packed with little details for young readers to discover.



How the Slants<sup>®</sup> Took Their Fight for Free Speech to the Supreme Court By MIA WENJEN Illustrated by VICTOR BIZAR GÓMEZ

Music is a way to transcend cultures and divides. Simon Tam used his band's name, The Slants<sup>®</sup>, to make a powerful statement that racist insults could no longer be hurtful to Asian Americans. But then the U.S. Trade and Patent Office tries to stop him. In his eight-year battle to win trademark protection, Simon would go all the way to the Supreme Court in a landmark case to rout out structural racism in our government systems.

Written with the full collaboration of Simon Tam, Mia Wenjen takes us back to Simon's early days and the formation of the band, to the long battle to claim the name they chose to use. We learn of his motivations and the years-long struggle that leads ultimately to the Supreme Court of the United States. Told using lyrics from the band's hit song about their trademark fight, this compelling story will keep readers riveted until the dramatic ending. We Sing from the Heart gives background and context to the significance of Simon's quest, not just for him and his band, but for free speech rights for us all. Newcomer to children's books, Victor Bizar Gómez, channels the indie music world with dynamic artwork which compliments the storytelling and is sure to draw in readers with his exciting graphic approach.

# The Rescues Finding Home The Rescues Best Day Ever





# Patience pays off for Leo and his sisters as they wait for the bus to the park.



"This is the apple tree, *el manzano*, that grows near the house where Rosa lives.


